Thank you for your help in working with students enrolled in the Dual Enrollment Program at Southeastern. This program continues to be a success due to your partnership and efforts.

Correspondence is being sent to graduating seniors regarding applying, deadlines, and scholarships. As an update to the application process, we will no longer auto-apply Dual Enrollment students. Students will need to complete an application to the University. Once the application is submitted, they will then receive information on additional documents needed, housing options, financial aid, etc.

Students enrolled in Dual Enrollment courses may already qualify for multiple scholarship opportunities. Earlier this year, Southeastern instated a scholarship just for Dual Enrollment students. Students who apply **by January 15th** and meet the qualifications are also automatically considered for the new Priority Honors Scholarships. In addition, Southeastern introduced the Southeastern Promise, an initiative that shows our commitment to student success.
